

Latest developments on the CLV triangle

Dear Lauk Bora Touch,

I am reaching out to you with the hope that the e-mail that I have for you is still current.

First, allow me to introduce myself:

I am Borasmy Nicole Ung, a retired dentist living in the USA. I was one of the first people to organize Lauk Sean Pengsé and Sean Massavang's trips to the US, before the additional treaty of 2005 was signed, so that they could inform the people about the impending 2005 Khmer-Vietnam border agreements. I have continued to work with the Cambodian Borders Committee in France and Worldwide until now.

Secondly, less me express my gratitude and admiration for all your efforts to stop the loss of our territories to Vietnam and Thailand. I wish we had met and linked our efforts at the time so that we could have fought a united front against those who were betraying the interests of the nation.

The letter that you wrote to King Sihanouk was just shared with me by the CFC-CBC. In that letter, I saw that there are other conventions that we could raise, (according to the CFC-CBC), to invalidate all the pre-Paris Peace Agreements between Cambodia and Vietnam. We can discuss that later if you wish.

Third: the colonization of Cambodia by Vietnam is now about attain another a crucial stage: that of the ratification of the CLV Triangle of Development which will turn Cambodia and Laos into another Kampuchea Krom. This explains why the Hun Sen government is hurrying up to sign border agreements with Laos and Vietnam with unresolved portions and are now starting to negotiate border agreements with Thailand.

I am involved with a group of civil society organizations who have linked together, determined to fight for the survival of Cambodia for the long term, by using all the valid legal means that we can.

We overseas Cambodian have to become the preservers of documents that future generations of Cambodians can use to fight to get our territories back in the international court.
